Operational Data - July 2024 (year-over-year comparison):

1. CONTAINER TERMINALS:

Aggregate volumes increased 39.9% in July, boosted by exceptional performances at both terminals. Rio Grande reported a remarkable 462.3% increase in transshipment. Similarly, Salvador reported a record-breaking monthly performance for the second time in 2024, with growth in all trade flows. 7M24 volumes increased 29.9% in Rio Grande and 22.0% in Salvador.

1.1. Rio Grande terminal:

- Total volumes increased 48.6% mainly due to higher transshipment, empty container, inland navigation and cabotage flows;
- Exports decreased 6.2% with lower volumes of tobacco, pork and resins;
- Imports decreased 4.6% with lower volumes of chemicals, spare parts and leather;
- Cabotage increased 33.0% with higher volumes of rice, coal and resins;
- Inland navigation increased 168.1% with higher volumes of resins, pork and wood;
- Transshipment and shifting increased 462.3% driven by strong regional market share gains and off-schedule ship calls;
- Empty container volumes increased 23.2%; and
- 38 ships were serviced in the period (Jul/23: 37 ships).

1.2. Salvador terminal:

- Total volumes increased 27.3% driven by higher flows across the board;
- Exports increased 26.6% with higher volumes of cellulose, chemicals and cotton;
- Imports increased 34.6% with higher volumes of chemicals, steel products and packaging material;
- Cabotage increased 30.9% with higher volumes of chemicals, packaging material and rice;
- Transshipment and shifting increased 24.1% mainly due to higher transshipment of cargoes from Saudi Arabia, Argentina and the port of Navegantes, as well as volumes bound for the United States and the ports of Manaus and Suape;
- Empty container volumes increased 20.9%; and
- 43 ships were serviced in the period (Jul/23: 42 ships).

2. TOWAGE:

- Harbour manoeuvres decreased 2.1% mainly driven by a lower number of oil tankers, and container carriers. 7M24 manoeuvres increased 5.3%.
- The average deadweight of ships attended increased 2.4% due to a higher proportion of manoeuvres involving iron ore carriers.

3. OFFSHORE SUPPORT BASES:

- Vessel turnarounds increased 3.5% in July and 3.0% in 7M24.

4. OFFSHORE SUPPORT VESSELS:

- Days in operation increased 13.5% thanks to enhanced fleet utilisation driven by new hires and contract renewals. 7M24 operating days increased 7.0%.
