

Azul is the best in sustainability in aviation

The company was recognized in the SustentAr project, launched by Anac in 2022, which aims to recognize companies with best practices in sustainability

São Paulo, August 19, 2022 – Azul S.A., “Azul”, (B3: AZUL4, NYSE: AZUL), the largest airline in Brazil in terms of number of flights and cities served, was recognized for adopting the best practices in environmental management among national airline by the SustentAr project, launched by the National Civil Aviation Agency (Anac) this year.

Azul was the best evaluated in the category of regular air transportation companies, considering five groups related to sustainability in airlines: organizational management and environmental education; energy transition; operational efficiency; atmospheric emissions and natural resources.

Azul was the first airline in Brazil to join the United Nations (UN) Global Compact, reinforcing its commitment to socio-environmental responsibility and the Sustainable Development Goals, in its commitment to be carbon neutral by 2045 and being part of the 2030 ambition movement, also of the UN. Currently, the company is part of the carbon offset and reduction scheme for international aviation CORSIA.

In addition to a sustainable financial business model, Azul focuses on three pillars: eco-efficient operation through operational excellence and maximum aircraft integrity; engaged and healthy crew members, loyal customers and suppliers, and involved communities, creating an equitable society and a fair economy; and social and economic development that protects the planet through innovative and passionate projects.

"Azul is 19% more fuel efficient today compared to 2016. Today, we transport more customers and emit less carbon than six years ago, due to our fleet transformation and renewal. We have the youngest fleet in the region and operate 70% of our seats with more efficient, low-carbon aircraft, one of our main pillars in sustainability," says John Rodgerson, CEO of Azul.
